The history of the pound-sterling and the U.S. dollar reveals the fact that such factors as the network of foreign trade and economic size constitute the basis and "inertia" of a key-currency. Thus for a currency to rise to a key-position in global transactions, real factors are more decisive than financial market arrangement.
