Play the Najdorf Sicilian - James Rizzitano 2010

The Najdorf Sicilian has a unique place amongst chess openings: for several decades it has been regarded by the top grandmasters as the best way for Black to play soundly for a win against 1 e4. It was a particular favourite of World Champions Bobby Fischer and Garry

Kasparov, and plays a vital role in the repertoires of current top players such as Viswanathan Anand and Veselin Topalov. Black's stance is totally uncompromising. He accepts no organic weaknesses and stays flexible, ready to counterpunch in any part of the board. White has no safe or easy option. On the other hand, he does have a vast array of extremely dangerous attacking options, such as the old 6 Bg5 main line, which can lead to the Poisoned Pawn, a variation that has undergone much development in the 21st century. The current main line is 6 Be3, intending the English Attack. But given the Najdorf's importance, White has tried almost everything imaginable in the search for an advantage, with considerable bodies of theory evolving for lines that contain merely a drop of poison. In the ever-changing Najdorf landscape, it is easy to lose sight of the strategic backbone that underpins the Najdorf. In this book, James Rizzitano, a battle-hardened Sicilian warrior, distils the most important ideas and themes from current practice to provide an ideal guide for those looking to succeed as White or Black in the Najdorf in the modern scientific era.

Understanding Chess Middlegames - John Nunn 2012-01

The three-times World Chess Solving Champion distils the most useful middlegame concepts and knowledge into 100 lessons that everyone can understand. Following on from his successful *Understanding Chess Endgames*, John Nunn turns his attention to the middlegame - the phase of the chess battle where most games are decided, yet the one that has received the least systematic treatment from chess writers. Both sides' ideas are emphasized, so we get a clear picture of the ways to disrupt typical plans as well as how to form them.

How can one determine if a piece is weak or strong? Or if a square is weak or strong? These are the principal questions that grandmaster and trainer Drazen Marovic addresses in this important book. By discussing carefully chosen games and positions, Marovic explains how to recognize good and bad features of positions, and how to make use of one's advantages and exploit the opponent's weaknesses. One repeatedly sees 'weaknesses' that are unexploitable (and therefore are not weaknesses at all), possibilities of surrendering certain squares in order to gain more important ones, and material sacrifices to exploit major weaknesses. Topics include: outposts; strength and weakness on files and diagonals; vulnerabilities on the first and second ranks; static weakness and attack; and characteristics of the pieces.

Aberturas De Xadrez - Danilo Marques 2022-01-29

Os Movimentos de Abertura, ou simplesmente Aberturas, ou Defesas, são sequências de movimentos iniciais do jogo de xadrez, desenvolvendo-se as peças de forma a garantir uma disposição sólida de defesa e um ataque eficientemente bom. É a batalha pelo centro, se desenvolve as peças menores em certas linhas retas de ação, iniciando a pressão sobre o centro. Existem dezenas de aberturas diferentes, com centenas de variantes catalogadas, onde a Oxford Companion to Chess reconheceu 1 327 aberturas e variantes. Estas possuem nomes como por exemplo Defesa Siciliana ou Gambito da dama recusado, que geram variações desde posições tranquilas (por exemplo Abertura Réti e algumas linhas do Gambito da Dama Recusado) a táticas de jogo arrojadas (por exemplo Gambito Letão e Defesa dos dois cavalos). Em algumas linhas de aberturas, os movimentos considerados melhores têm sido estudados até o vigésimo lance, onde enxadristas profissionais dedicam anos de estudos em aberturas, e a teoria das aberturas continua a evoluir
